# Stakeholders Meeting

### 1. April 5th - Meeting with SDM, Dhanolti - Mr. Laxmi Raj Chauhan

- We represented both MMT Foundation and Waste Warriors, and put in place our role and contributions to support & have an independent sustainable waste management model for the area.
- Highlighted the challenges we found to have hampered the process
- Recognition & appreciation by SDM. He then directed Zila Panchayat to work together with WW for the coming season
- Capacity building to be done with all the on-ground waste pickers

# 2. April 7th - Meeting with District Magistrate, Tehri Garwhal - Mrs. Iva Ashish Srivastava

- Waste Warriors & ZP will work together to address gaps in the SWM
- Capacity building and training of supervisors and ZP sweepers will be provided by WW.
- ZP will draft SWM & user fee bylaws, and email the proposal to the DM keeping the Police Department in the loop for approval. Post which the DM will issue a special letter for user fee collection.
- A vehicle for the collection of dry & wet waste will be provided by ZP

#### 3. April 14th - Visit of Mr. Sanjay Khanduri, Upper Zila Panchayat Officer

- Mr. Sanjay Khanduri visited the Kempty area & reviewed the work of the contractor and on-ground team
- A joint meeting with sanitation workers, ZP contractor, and Waste Warriors
  was held to talk about the current waste management system, gaps, and
  ways to improve it with the help of various stakeholders involved
- Waste Warriors will be monitoring the work and highlight the gaps to the contractor & Mr. Sanjay
- WW, powered by MMT Foundation, is installing dustbins that will be maintained by ZP workers







# CAPACITY BUILDING: DIRECT ACTION & TRANSFORMATION INITIATIVES

## **WASTE COLLECTION**

Mid - April, post the visit of the Zila Panchayat officer, the ZP contractor and his workers have started dry waste collection from the Kempty village market and Kempty Fall areas. Dry waste is collected, stored at defined holding area's and later is sent to the MRF twice a week.

WW is working on-ground and registering our daily observations. The goal is to have a sustainable way to run the ecosystem with the help of CCELS, ZP, and the local community.







### **Key Highlights:**

- Collected 1018.7 kg of dry waste and sent it for further sorting and processing to Waste Warriors Harrawala Swachhta Kendra.
- Distributed 30 big sacks to Zila Panchayat sanitation workers for waste collection.
- Challenges identified: limited storage points and limited transport vendors in the vicinity



# Clean-up drives

Dates: 7th April (World Health Day) & 28th April 2022

Locations: Kempty village market area & Banglo Ki Kandi Village.

Number of people: Mobilized and sensitized 70 volunteers from local

communities

Waste collected:

#### Brief:

- 1 Created awareness and engaged the local shopkeeper's union and the community on the agenda.
- 2 A session on the ill effects of waste burning was conducted with the community including the Pradhans of Kempty and Banglo Ki Kandi villages
- 3 Post activity, treated all participants to tea & snacks





### **Key Highlights:**

- Had 22 women (homemakers) attending the awareness session & participating in the clean-up drives
- 40 anti-littering pledges signed by local people and tourists

# **Way Forward**

- Next clean up on the 22nd of May, on the occasion of World Biodiversity Day.
- 100 door-to-door IEC activities.
- Three street plays in collaboration with Tabeer Theatre For All Foundation
- Installation of Five dustbins
- Survey of 100 people from Kandi and Kempty village.
- Onboarding one community mobilizer for Kandi village
- Dark spot transformation
- Training and capacity building of sanitation workers
- Pledge signing of 30 more people
- Installation of 2 Anti-littering boards within the area
- Initiate ideation & groundwork for art installation
- Two community meetings with Kempty village community and Hotel association
- Repair of one pushkart rickshaw.
